Radius

1-Proximal end The proximal end includes:

A- A head

B- Neck

C- Tuberosity

<u>2-Shaft</u>

The shaft is triangular in section The interosseous border is sharp <u>**3-Distal end</u>** It is four-sided in section. A-Styloid process B-Lister's tubercle **C- carpal articular surface, The lateral is triangular for scaphoid bone The medial is quadrangular for lunate bone**</u>

D-The medial surface is the **ulnar notch**,

which is smooth for articulation with the head of the ulna

A-It has large olecranon

B-coronoid processes

C-Trochlear and radial notches which articulate with the humerus and radius
