



The introduction of the manuscript not the report!







Results

- Organize around tables/figures
- Present tabular results selectively in text
- Past tense
- No interpretation; just the facts!
- Tables should stand on their own

• One paragraph per table or figure


Results

Start with

Number of participants, key characteristics such as gender, mean or median age..

First table should be the baseline characteristics

- We might use the key findings to present the background characteristics
- Next should be the figure or table showing the primary outcome



The Discussion Section

- 1st paragraph: answer question/hypothesis
- Remainder:
 - Evidence pro and con: literature review
 - Strengths/limitations of your study
 - Implications of findings (be conservative)
 - Other findings of your study
- Last Paragraph: conclusion

Discussion

- Good phrases to begin:
 - "The results from this study showed that...
 - "Our results indicate that....
 - "The purpose of this study was to...and we...etc
- Be bold, explain precisely what you have found and explain how it will add to current knowledge or change healthcare
- Second paragraph address the strengths and limitations
- Third paragraph should put the research in context of what is already known in the field
