# Mid:

## **Group A1:**

examine the pericardium (inspection & auscultation) + cough hx

## **Group A2:**

examine lymph nodes & assume there's a mass and describe it (space spit) + chest pain hx

#### **GB1**:

JVP + shortness of breath hx

## GB2:

a history (a station of low T4/T3, normal TSH): indicates a hypothyroidism case & we should ask and discover the causes

+ anterior thoracic examinations (palpation + auscultation)

- Take a history + what is the diagnosis most likely according to the history.
- 2 investigations -> (ultrasound + auto-antibodies)

This one is from internal medicine (looks like the previous hx)

<sup>1.</sup> Hx. 30 year old female, complains of fatigue, irregular mense, with T3, T4, TSH lab tests are lower than normal (and the normal range is given with the question).

# Final:

## **GA1:**

Red urine hx + GI palpation & organomegaly examination (they told us to skip kidney)

## GA2:

Thyroid + hematemesis hx

## **GB1**:

lower motor system + abdominal pain hx

## GB2:

cerebellar examination (coordination) (must mention speech, gait, eye, tone & power lower and upper + apraxia)

+ diarrhea history
